*PRAYER OF CONFESSION





The pre-recorded worship service will include many of the elements that we enjoy at our traditional services – readings, carols, candlelight, and communion – presented with a 2020 twist! Members and friends are INVITED to stop by St. Peter's between 3-5pm on both Dec 23rd and 24th to pick up a small gift bag for each member of the household. Bags will include a "Silent Night" hand-held candle with protective circle, a candy cane, and a consecrated single-serve communion pack that has been blessed by Pastor. We do this to increase the personal connection with St. Peter's that we have all been missing so much lately. We will also host a Zoom Gathering at 6:00 PM on Christmas Eve – a chance to chat with friends and fellowship with one another just before the Christmas Eve Worship service at 7 PM. So, to recap:

- Dec 24 at 6pm Join members and friends for a Zoom Gathering Dec 24 at 7pm – Worship with the Christmas Eve Worship Service on YouTube!

(If you plan to use your pre-filled Communion cup and wafer during our Christmas Eve virtual worship, it does not need to be pre-consecrated but it would be consecrated via prayer and the Spirit during the service. Pre-consecrated sets would work for those desiring the Communion right then and there or who do not have YouTube).

The Quarantine Weekly for last week again included information about our usual December mission projects and fundraisers, with links to lists or ways to donate. Please read it if you haven't, and check these email-letters regularly for important information. Something that was neglected but not any longer is the annual United Church of Christ offering for Veterans of the Cross and the Christmas Emergency Fund. Donations to this fund through

St. Peter's U.C.C. or directly help our retired (and in some cases still employed) clergy, widowed clergy spouses, and some lay employees with health insurance premium supplementation, emergency cash grants, pension supplementation for those retirees with low pension funds, and Christmas 'Thank You' gift checks. All gifts and supplementations are administered by the U.C.C. Pension Boards' charitable arm, the Board for Ministerial Assistance. Checks sent to the church should be marked in the memo section as designated for this Veterans of the Cross offering. Thank you!

About the Sunday School Advent Mission Project helping babies and infants through the Township Food Pantry: Drop-off times that remain are: Monday, December 21st from 9 AM to 11 AM, then 12PM to 2 PM (we'll be picking up the Holiday dinners at 11:15 AM from the Jewel) and Monday, January 4th from 9 AM to 2 PM. Supplies are for newborns and infants and include but not limited to diapers, wipes, onesies, toys, bath supplies, formula, etc.

Live Stream begins January 3rd at 10 AM – Beginning with the new year, you will still be able to watch your worship service on Sunday mornings on YouTube ... they will still include a link to the bulletin in the description (also available on our website every week under the "Worship" tab), and they will still feature everything our worship service always includes – Prelude, Call to Worship, Readings, Special Music, Sermon, Prayers, and Postlude. However, the service will be

broadcasted (aka streamed) LIVE AS IT HAPPENS from our Sanctuary on Sunday mornings. Lectors now have to come in to read. Important things to know about this are:

- We don't currently have people joining us in the sanctuary – we have not "regathered" for worship yet.
 But when we DO, we will also continue to live stream in this exact way (and maybe even better, as we learn more about what we are doing).
- You will find the live stream exactly where you find the video now – simply go to St Peter's UCC YouTube channel, and it will start playing automatically when the service begins.
- If you can't watch it right at 10 AM the video will be available immediately following the service under "Past Live Streams." Let us know if you have any problems with this.
- Broadcasting the live service will hopefully give the feel of being actually IN the church, which we are all eager to get back to.

Birthing a Promise Christmas Fund Offering

Today is the fourth Sunday of Advent, the season of watchful waiting for the coming of the Christ Child. If you have practiced a ritual of lighting Advent candles, either in community or in your own home, then this Sunday you will light all four candles. As we do, we celebrate and acknowledge the gifts of this season - Hope, Peace, Joy, and Love.

On this fourth Sunday of Advent, we are also invited to receive the Christmas Fund Offering. As the promise of God's light and presence shines through the advent candles, we can bring hope, peace, joy, and love to those we honor with our special offering. Soon it will be time to put the advent wreath away for another year. But through your gift to the Christmas Fund Offering, you can keep hope, peace, joy, and love alive all year long for those who have served the church.

The Christmas Fund funds four programs: Christmas Thank You Checks, Pension Supplementation, Health Benefits, and Emergency Grants.

Christmas Thank You Checks are for retired United Church of Christ clergy and lay employees. Retirees with limited financial resources receive a gift at Christmas time as a way of saying "thank you" for years of service to the UCC. Last year, more than a quarter million dollars was given to 521 individuals, and the number of those helped increases every year.

Pension Supplementation is for lower-income retired United Church of Christ clergy and lay employees. These are monthly payments designed to bring household incomes up to a basic level to be able to afford basic needs like food, utilities, and medical expenses.

Health Benefits supplementation is for lower-income retired UCC clergy and lay employees who may receive assistance in paying Medicare premiums.

Emergency Grants are for currently active or retired clergy or lay employees who are facing unforeseen circumstances that create financial need.
