FUNDrive Coming

In January we will be doing our annual FUNDrive. This is when we collect soft goods to take to Savers. We receive \$0.20/pound for these items. In the past few years, we have raised anywhere from \$700 -\$1,000 with this effort. We will be collecting items in the gym throughout the month of January. Soft goods include all clothing, linens, belts, shoes, and purses. They will be loaded up and taken over to Savers on February 10th at 10am. Please mark your calendar to come out and help load the truck.

Worship with us on CHRISTMAS EVE

Christmas Eve is on a Sunday this year, which means we will celebrate the *Fourth Sunday of Advent in the 10 AM service on December 24th*. There will be the lighting of the Candle of Joy, but the service will be without Holy Communion. We will celebrate the birth of Jesus at the evening service, which will include the Lord's Supper, along with lessons, carols, an Anthem, a homily, and

closing candlelight. For those who have not joined us for worship recently and may be wondering, pews are not currently roped off in any part of the sanctuary. Masks are always recommended but not required; you might be more likely to wear one if Christmas Eve worship might bring a larger gathering. Oh, and the time? 7:00 PM is our only Christmas Eve service. Both morning and evening services will be live streamed as has been the case in previous years. But come in person!

SUNDAY SCHOOL ADVENT MISSION PROJECT

This year, as in years past, your Board for Christian Education and the Sunday School invite your participation in its Advent Mission Project to collect new items for newborns and things their parents could use for them. These important items, gathered as if part of a "baby shower for baby Jesus," will go to the Niles Township Food Pantry, which distributes a lot more than food these days! There are specific items that

the Township is asking for: *Baby* food, formula, lotion, shampoo, Cheerios, diapers, fruit cups, fruit snacks, juice/milk boxes, pudding cups, wipes. No clothes or blankets. The donations may be placed under the Christmas tree. We will end collection at the end of December. Thank you; we know diapers are very expensive, but the leader of the Township confirms that they are very much needed and appreciated!

It has been decided to return to passing the offering plate during worship, an act of worship that is part of our joy and our identity as people following Jesus Christ through His church. We will begin this return on **Sunday, December 3rd**.

FROM THE MINISTER'S DESK

In the readings from Isaiah in this season of Advent, Israel is waiting for Messiah, to deliver them – from exile in Babylon, from this corrupt and unfaithful world, and to a new realm where God reigns supreme and so will Israel, like they did when David ruled. So, one of the major themes of this time in the Christian year is waiting, hoping, reviving our anticipation for deliverance, and changing our lives' directions so we are ready and facing the Deliverer when the Deliverer arrives at last.

What does deliverance look like for you this Advent? From what or whom do you desire an escape? Where does our ultimate Deliverer, Jesus of Nazareth, the Christ of God, the Light of the world, fit into this deliverance? How is Christ the Deliverer that you need, that we need?

Don't you love it when I pepper you with questions, be it in a sermon or in this space?

How is Jesus 'deliverer' for you? He can deliver us from, or deliver us to, or for.

For me one of the ways Jesus is my Deliverer is that He delivers my life from what could be meaninglessness. In Christ's service and in following Him is where my life gets purpose and meaning. When I once felt that God's call on me was a cruel joke, that meant that my life had become instantly a joke too. I felt crucified. Thank God that did not last! But if you have ever felt that way, or are feeling that way, do not be discouraged. Feelings are not facts; emotions are not necessarily truth. God does not play jokes on us; the deliverance we really need can be very real, even though we often must be patient through painful times. It can come in a variety of people and ways, and we may not always be aware that it is the Lord who is delivering us! It is Christ who is saving us, who is giving us a new life in which to go and thrive.

But first, the baby had to be born and placed in a manger. This birth we eagerly celebrate and know that our Deliverer has come.


