## From the Minister's Desk

*When I was a seminary student, I admitted to a small table of fellow students that I had a problem with Advent. Why were we in the church getting ready to mark an event that happened almost two thousand years ago? Are we going through motions, pretending it has not happened yet? What's the point of 'getting ready' for the arrival of Jesus, which is in the past? Maybe you have had similar thoughts. After expressing mine, though, friend Bruce Robinson said to me, "If you have that attitude, you're going to have problems in the parish."*

*I have learned that getting ready and preparing for the Incarnation of the Word is a worthwhile spiritual journey. Sure, Jesus was born centuries upon centuries ago, but what His coming means (for us personally, for our families, our systems, for the world) is always ripe for reflection, exploration, and action. I learned in seminary, for example, that Advent, like Lent, was originally a season of repentance and self-inventory, working on turning away from our sins so that we are more cleansed, more disciplined, more selflessly loving and therefore more prepared to meet the Lord of Love.*

*Some of you who were here around 20 years ago will remember the mother and daughters Askharia; they wore lace upon their heads as a symbol of repentance. It was a time of fasting, like Lent. Advent features John the Baptist, for crying out loud, and that was one of his main messages! Get ready for the One who is coming who is mightier than he, who will baptize with fire and the Spirit, by changing the orientation of your spirit and life towards God.*

*We have seen nativity scenes with Santa Claus kneeling before the manger along with the shepherds or magi. Why not? For this season is when we are asked to come to grips with the faith-fact that Jesus came, even for us. Who are we that God should freely go to such lengths as to send the Son who would be the Light of the world, the Shepherd of the Sheep, and the Lamb of God who (painfully) takes away the sin of the world? Such humility is surely appropriate for Advent, as we do some of that self-examination and aspire to come closer to the God who has already drawn so near to us.*

*We should not need a church season to emphasize this, among other beautiful aspects of Advent. But Jesus knew that we need to be reminded: "Do this in remembrance of me." If we do not get reminded, and go through some programs of spiritual growth again, we humans will forget. Jesus did not come to be forgotten, but to save the world by the power of truth and grace. That makes Advent not a problem but a blessing. May your Advent be a season of generous spiritual discovery and peace!*

**December 18, 2022** The Christmas Fund has been caring for active and retired clergy and lay employees of the United Church of Christ for over 100 years, providing emergency grants, supplementation of small annuities and health premiums, and Christmas "Thank You" gift checks each December to our lower-income retirees. United Church of Christ congregations and members have blessed the Christmas Fund with their generosity for many years. This year, your care and compassion will be especially appreciated by those servants of the church who are facing a time of need. In 2021, gifts to the Christmas Fund enabled:

- Monthly pension supplementation for 231 retired clergy and lay employees (\$1,104,479);
- Health benefits supplementation for 87 retired clergy and laypersons (\$177,600);
- Emergency grants for 53 individuals and families (\$150,338);
- Christmas "Thank You" Gift checks to 509 clergy family and lay employees (\$254,000).

These numbers have gone down over recent years for a variety of reasons, but the number of our retired pastors and their spouses have increased, as those born after 1946 are retiring more and more. Please join our Pastor in giving generously if you are able for those who have given so much to us and our churches. You'll hear stories about those who have benefited in the past, during upcoming December worship services, and our focus collection date is December 18th, though contributions are gladly received throughout the month of December.
